Laundry workers are entitled to a safe workplace, especially during this Coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak.

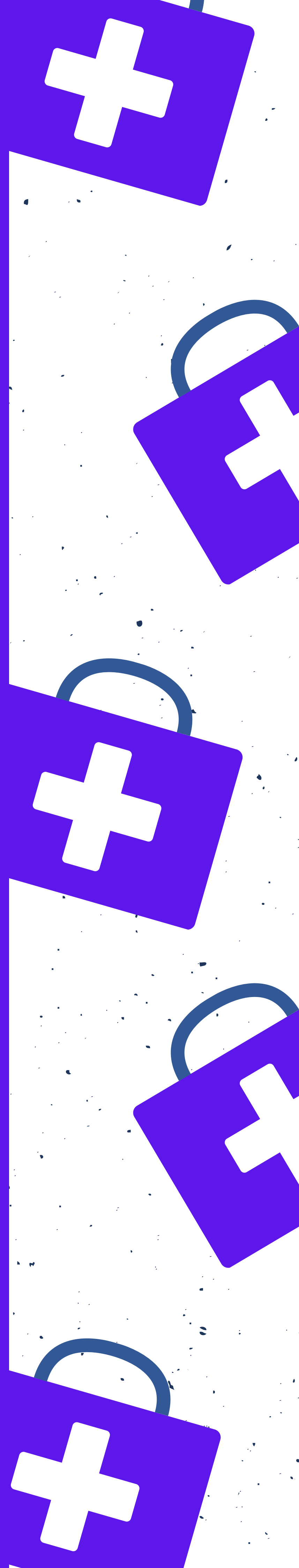
Is your employer following these important safety practices?

- The employer should inform all workers that if they are sick they should not come to work.
- Soil room employees and drivers should be provided Personal Protective Equipment such as masks, gloves, goggles and gowns.
- Employees should be provided ample handwashing stations (soap and water) and hand sanitizer that is at least 60% alcohol.
- Employees should work at least 6 feet away from each other.
- Lunch and breaks should be staggered to minimize crowding so workers can be at least 6 feet away from each other.
- Worksite meetings should be limited to no more than 10 employees at a time.
- All soiled product must be contained in a sealed plastic bag and inside a bin.

Is your employer following these important safety practices?
